<b>Field Name</b>	<b>Definition</b>
<b>Facility Name</b>	The facility name
<b>Address</b>	The facility address
<b>County</b>	Refers to the county in which the facility is located
<b>City</b>	Refers to the city in which the facility is located
<b>Zip</b>	Refers to the zip code in which the facility is located
<b>Phone</b>	Refers to the phone number associated with the facility
<b>Fax</b>	Refers to the facsimile number of the facility
<b>Operator</b>	Refers to the operator of the facility
<b>Certificate Number</b>	The Operating Certificate number of the facility
<b>Number of Beds</b>	Refers to the maximum number of ACF beds allowed. These beds are certified by the NYSDOH under Article 7 of the New York State Social Services Law
<b>Assisted Living Program Beds</b>	Refers to the maximum number of Assisted Living Program (ALP) beds allowed
<b>Assisted Living Residence Beds</b>	Refers to the maximum number of Assisted Living Residence (ALR) beds allowed
<b>Enhanced ALR Beds</b>	Refers to the maximum number of Assisted Living Residence (EALR) beds allowed
<b>Special Need ALR Beds</b>	Refers to the maximum number of Special Needs Assisted Living Residence (SNALR) beds allowed
<b>Type</b>	The type of Adult Care Facility
<b>AH</b>	Adult Home – An adult home is established and operated for the purpose of providing long-term residential care, room, board, housekeeping, personal care and supervision to five or more adults unrelated to the operator. Adult Homes may be operated by a natural person, a partnership, a not-for-profit corporation, a public corporation, a non-publicly traded business corporation, or a limited liability company
<b>ALP</b>	Assisted Living Program – An assisted living program, which is available in some adult homes and enriched housing programs, combines residential and home care services. It is designed as an alternative to nursing home placement for individuals who historically have been admitted to nursing facilities for reasons that are primarily social, rather than medical in nature. The operator of an assisted living program is responsible for providing or arranging for resident services that must include room, board, housekeeping, supervision, personal care, case management, and home health services.

<b>EHP</b>	Enriched Housing Program – An enriched housing program is established and operated for the purpose of providing long-term residential care to five or more adults, primarily persons sixty-five years of age or older, in community-integrated settings resembling independent housing units. The program provides or arranges for the provision of room, board, housekeeping, personal care, and supervision. Enriched housing programs may be operated by a natural person, a partnership, a not-for-profit corporation, a non-publicly traded business corporation, or a limited liability company
<b>Classification</b>	The classification of the Adult Care Facility
<b>NFP</b>	Not for Profit. NFP is defined as a (Not for Profit) Adult Care Facility
<b>PPHA</b>	Private Proprietary Home for Adults – Defined in Title 18NYCRR, Part 487.2(b) of the Department Regulations as an adult care facility which is operated for compensation and profit.
<b>Regional Office</b>	The Department of Health’s regional office that the facility falls within
<b>CDRO</b>	Capital District Regional Office
<b>CNYRO</b>	Central New York Regional Office
<b>MARO</b>	Metropolitan Area Regional Office
<b>WRO</b>	Western Regional Office
